Come, Follow Me: A Disciple's Journey Through Lent

"Perhaps somewhere in the subterranean chambers of your life you have heard the call to deeper, fuller living. You have become weary of frothy experiences and shallow teaching. Every now and then, you have caught glimpses, hints of something more than you have known. Inwardly you long to launch out into the deep."

Richard J. Foster (Celebration of Discipline: The Path to Spiritual Growth)

In just a few short days we begin our Lenten journey, a time of self-examination and reflection. In the Presbyterian Church, when we join the church, we vow to a Lifelong Discipleship

Formation in our daily life. It is about how we claim and proclaim our identity as followers of Christ. It is about how we practice our faith; how we grow in faith, cherish faith, and share faith in the world.

Beyond mere words, it is about daily seeking and living in relationship with our living God. Thus, Lifelong Discipleship Formation is about the call to daily take up our cross and follow Christ wherever He is leading us.

These last few months, after I accepted God's call to be your transitional pastor, I have done a lot of reading and research

concerning churches in transition as well as the shift and restructuring happening in the church due to all the upheaval our world has seen these last few years. And what I discovered from each of these authors is their primary concern in the movement from being an institutional church to a living body of Christ. From being a member of a church to a disciple of Jesus.

So, you might be asking yourself, "Ronnie what does this have to do with Trinity and us finding our next pastor?" Well, at its

simplest, one of my jobs is to look at who you are as a church, to discover if God is calling Trinity for a new congregational identity, and to help you all to prepare for new pastoral leadership **and** <u>a new future</u>. At its simplest the focus of these authors and my time as your transitional pastor is to ask, "who are you as a church and what is God calling you to be!" You see, if we identify ourselves as members of the church, we are free to come and go at will. If we identify ourselves as Christ's disciples, everything we do falls under the authority and power of Christ. We live our commitment to Christ through the church and through all our actions. Our lives are less about going to church, being part of a denominational institution, and more about **being** the church and being lead by Christ's Spirit!

That's why I am excited to invite you to you to join Trinity's Session and Trinity's Mission Study Team in 40 days of praying for Trinity Presbyterian Church as we learn how to sail with the Holy Spirit and go where God is leading us. Our Devotional Guide is adapted from the *Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice* by Joan S. Gray. In the book she writes, "If a church is to sail [where God is calling it], there must be a critical mass of people who are willing to become sailors. Only God can make the changes in our life that will turn those of us who are by nature rowers [moving where we want to go] into sailors [going where God wants us to go]. However, sailing begins with praying. Participating in interactive prayer puts us where the Holy Spirit can make us into sailors."

It's for this reason my sermon theme for Lent this year will be, "Come, Follow Me: A Disciple's Journey Through Lent," where we'll look at defining moments of Jesus, moments we are called to adopt.

- Week 1: The Baptism of Jesus (Matt. 3:13-17) What does it mean for us to be baptized into Christ?
- Week 2: Wilderness and Temptations of Jesus (Matt. 4:1-11) What are the challenges to our identity as Christian followers?

• Week 3: The Beatitudes, Salt and Light (Matt. 5:1-16) – How are we embracing and living these values of God's kingdom?

- Week 4: Prayer and Attitude (Matt. 6:1-18) How are we engaged in the work of introspection and prayer?
- Week 5: Healing, Exorcism, Service, and Following (Matt. 8:14-27) What is our ministry? How are we following Christ in ministry and mission?

Both our Lenten Devotion and Sermon Series is to be the foundation for the church's discernment process that will begin on the Monday after Easter where you all will be invited to participate in a "14 Day Exercise in Faithful Listening." Then on May 4th immediately after church we will have an all church "Gleaning" session to gather, discuss, and prioritize the key ideas generated by individuals during the Faithful Listening process and any insights gathered during our Lenten Devotions. It's from all these spiritual disciplines that the Mission Study Team will write their report which will be the basis on your next pastors' call. I know it seems like a lot but what an opportunity to shape your church, her future, as well as deepen your faith.

The monk Thomas Merton wrote, "Ask me not where I live and what I like to eat. Ask me what I am living for and what I think is keeping me from living fully for that." My prayer is that this Lenten series and our Faithful Listening discernment process will give us all the nudge we need to live more deeply as disciples of Jesus Christ, as we discern together, where God is leading, who God is calling us to become, and who God is calling to join us in this journey.


This Lent 2025 let us all get in the boat and, "Come, follow Jesus!"

Trinity's session met on February 25 at 7:00 p.m. Here's a recap of actions taken:

- Reinstated Rob Dolliver and Angie Meisenheimer to the active membership roll.
- Approved Brian Griffith, Cathy Holder, Rob Humfeld, Chris Sheriff, and Susan Winkelmann as members of the Mission Study Team.
- Approved Rev. Osborn's plan for congregational discernment beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing through Sunday, May 4.
- ♦ Approved the formation of a Permanent Funds Subcommittee of the Stewardship and Finance Committee. This subcommittee will oversea the February 15th Fund as well as a new endowment fund which is being established.


