## **Michael's Musings**

How do you say what can't be said? I can tell you that it is a strange thing to be leaving a group of people I have loved as deeply as you - who have been at the center of my thoughts and feelings during nearly every waking moment for the last decade. I rotate from waves of grief to being among you as usual, to being anxious about what is ahead, to being, well just plain tired. Letting go is hard but let go, I must. As I do, however, with love, I leave you with the following last words:

1. As individuals, this is not a time to step back to see what is next. It is a time to step up your game. More is required from

everyone – especially after a healthy, thriving pastorate. If asked to serve – especially as an elder, you need to agree to serve if it's at all possible. For it is clear that "You were called for such a time as this." (Esther 4:14). To refuse an invitation to serve when you can, could be detrimental to the future of this congregation. Currently there are about four or five families at Trinity that do about 90% of the work that must be done on a regular basis. That family number really could stand to double in the transition period.

- 2. When things don't run as smoothly as they have, and there is a good chance they won't even with Ann Bouchard at the administrative helm instead of griping or looking for someone to blame, pitch in and ask how you can help. I can tell you that Ann's work ethic is greater than that of every hard-working individual I have ever encountered. And not only that, but she is also efficient and gifted in whatever she sets her mind to. She is the sharpest person I have ever encountered when it comes to knowing what needs to happen next in a congregation for the good of all. Think of Ann as the catcher on a baseball team that is Trinity. She is the only one who sees the full action on the field at every moment and as such sees more than any other individual player on that field. Listen to her.
- 3. Remember who you are, continuing to love one another as Christ has loved you. Give each other the benefit of the doubt. Be kind. If you have to say something, let it be loving and encouraging. Expect to serve rather than to be served.
- 4. Support the Session and the Pastor Nominating Committee by extending your appreciation, praying for them and asking them what you can do for them.

I guess that's about it. The rest I will leave for my last Sunday. I do love you all, will continue to pray for you and will miss you terribly.

#### **Trinity Library - Book Highlight** with Marianne Fues, Trinity Librarian


#### <u>unfettered hope:A Call to Faithful Living in an</u> <u>Affluent Society</u> by Marva J.Dawn

For what do we hope? Many would say peace in the world. Others might express more personal hopes such as happiness, financial security, an easier life. Many have their hopes blocked.

We can become overwhelmed by the quantity of information, by employment uncertainties, by multiple responsibilities, by insecurities, by despair. Dawn says there are three ways to respond to being overwhelmed. We must acknowledge that we are overwhelmed. We must describe it and discover our situation is common. We don't want to drown in what overwhelms us. We want to attend to living.

Community is found in groups who are gathered for a common purpose – exercise, recreation, reading. As we work together, Dawn shows how Christians can arrange their lives and live such that allows loving God and neighbors to reduce despair in lives of self and others.



# **Highlights from the August Session Meeting**

The August stated meeting of session was held on Tuesday evening, August 13. At the meeting:


- session called a congregational meeting for Sunday, September 1 at the conclusion of worship for the purpose of concurring with Rev. Stanfield's request to dissolve the pastoral relationship between himself and Trinity so that he may accept a position as a full-time therapist with The Vine in Huntsville, Alabama;
- received a report from the Clerk that annual personnel reviews with Ann Bouchard, Debbie Newkirk, J. West, and Jim West will be completed before Michael Stanfield's departure.
- ♦ approved a request to designate the remaining \$7,700 in the property improvements fund for another HVAC unit;
- ♦ approved a request from the Property Committee for upgrades to the Memorial Garden;
- heard a report that the Christian Education Committee was working to spruce up the children's classrooms before the start of Sunday School and to line up teachers for the children's and youth's classes;
- ♦ received the monthly financial report from Ann Bouchard. Income is ahead of expenses year to date by \$51,675.14.

Reverend Kathie Jackson has been appointed by the presbytery's Commission on Ministry to serve as Trinity's session moderator beginning in September.

The recent General Assembly action for congregations to lovingly and responsibly protect children from gun violence has been augmented by the U.S. Surgeon General's 2024 Advisory Report. It concludes that:

"The increasing number of children and adolescents dying from firearmrelated injuries and the reverberating mental health impacts on society make firearm violence an urgent public health crisis in America.

There are many experts and leaders who work tirelessly each day to protect families and communities from the trauma and suffering that have become all too common in our country... But it will take more—the collective commitment of the nation—to turn the tide on the crisis of firearm violence in America....

It is up to us to take on this generational challenge with the urgency and clarity the moment demands. The safety and
well-being of our children and future generations are at stake. "

### The Presbyterian Women Justice and Peace Book Discussion Group for September



In this landmark book, acclaimed sociologist Matthew Desmond draws on history, research and original reporting to show how affluent Americans knowingly and unknowingly keep poor people poor. ## **CROP Hunger Walk**

On Sunday, September 15th, you can be part of a community-wide effort to help combat hunger. CROP Hunger Walks are community based fundraising events held in cities and towns across the U.S. to address the issues of hunger and other residual effects of poverty worldwide.

The 24th annual Columbia CROP Walk participants will raise donations from supporters that will be used to address food insecurity. Twenty-five percent of the funds raised will provide grants to four local programs that specifically address hunger -- including Loaves and Fishes. Seventy-five percent will go to the CROP national sponsor, Church World Service.

There are four different ways you can be part of our Trinity Team:

- 1) During the week before the Walk, you can walk on your own schedule, keeping track of your miles or steps.
- 2) Walk Day you can join other Columbia participants at Stephens Park to walk and enjoy the activities planned for that day.
- 3) *Be a SPIRIT Walker* by contributing financially to sponsor walking members of our Trinity Team.

4) *<u>Do both</u>* walk and contribute financially.
